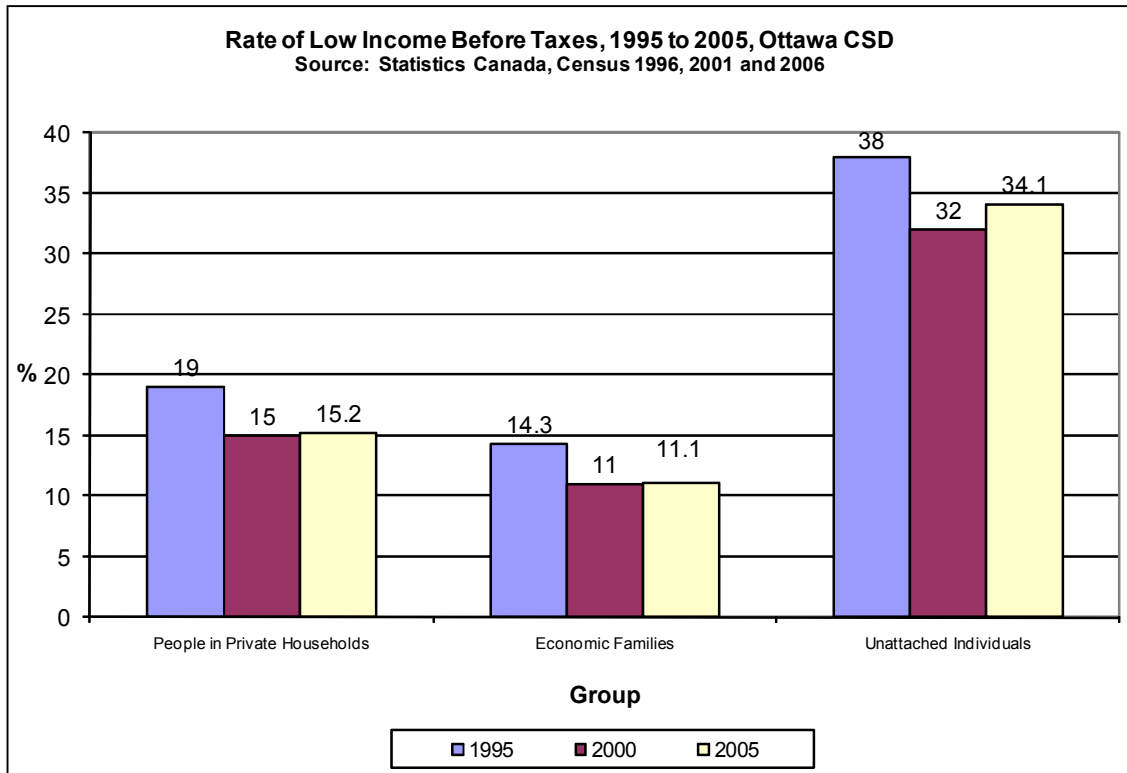

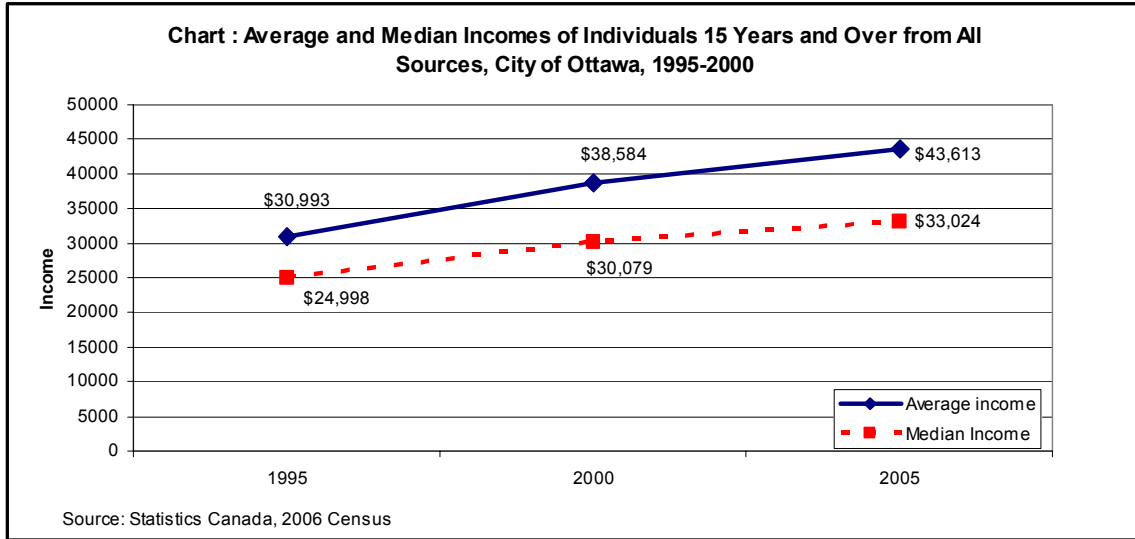

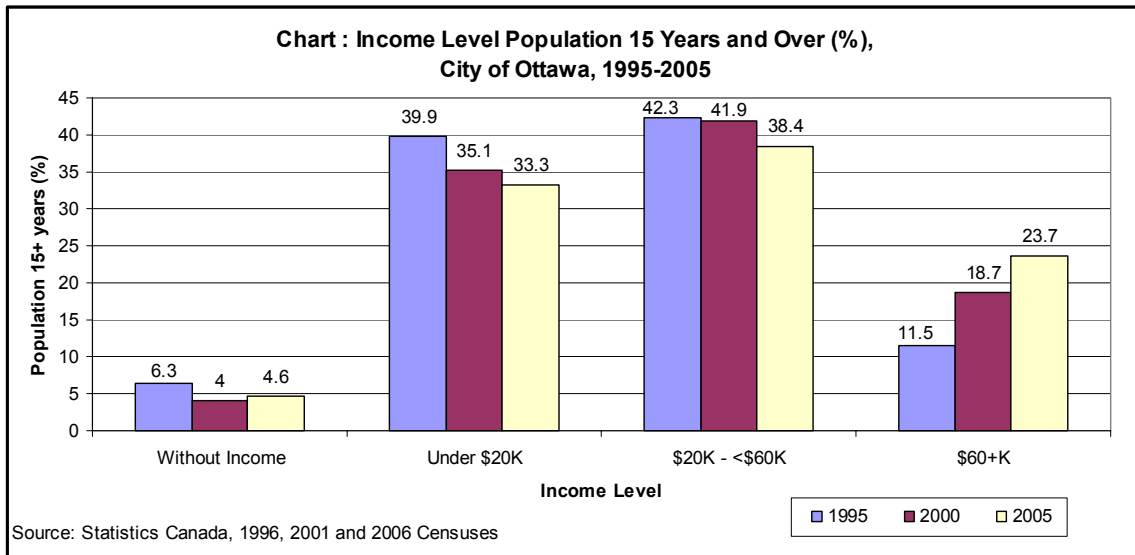

Income Level , 1995 – 2005

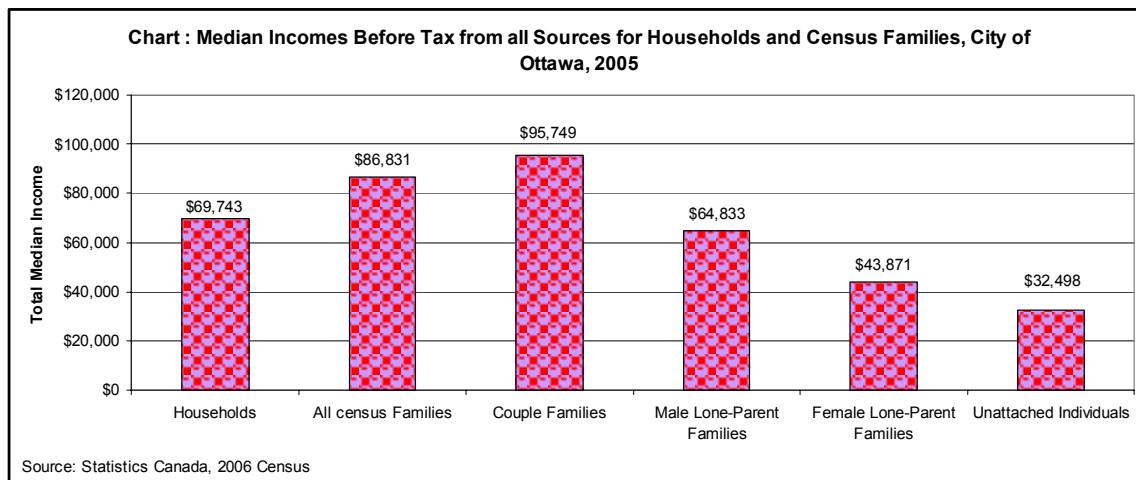

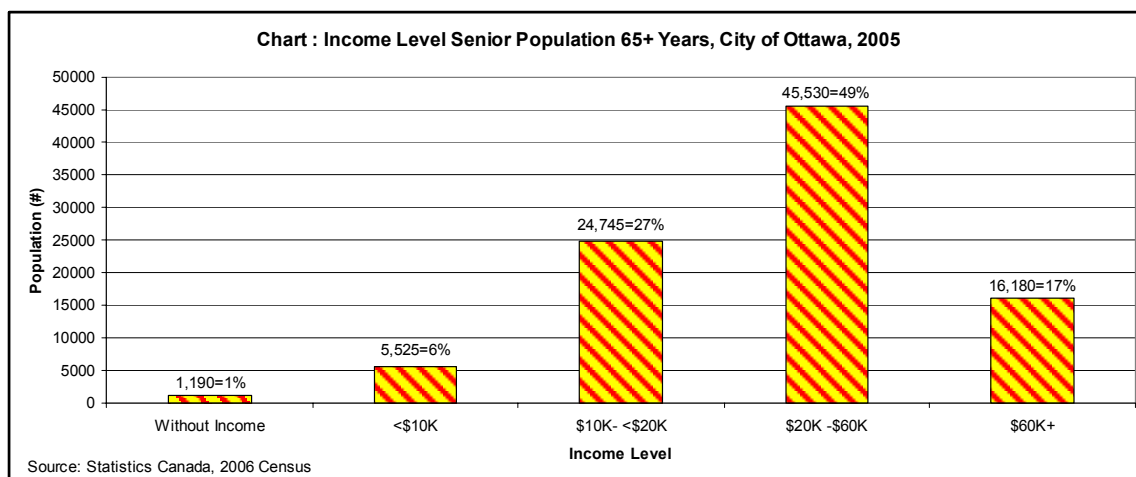

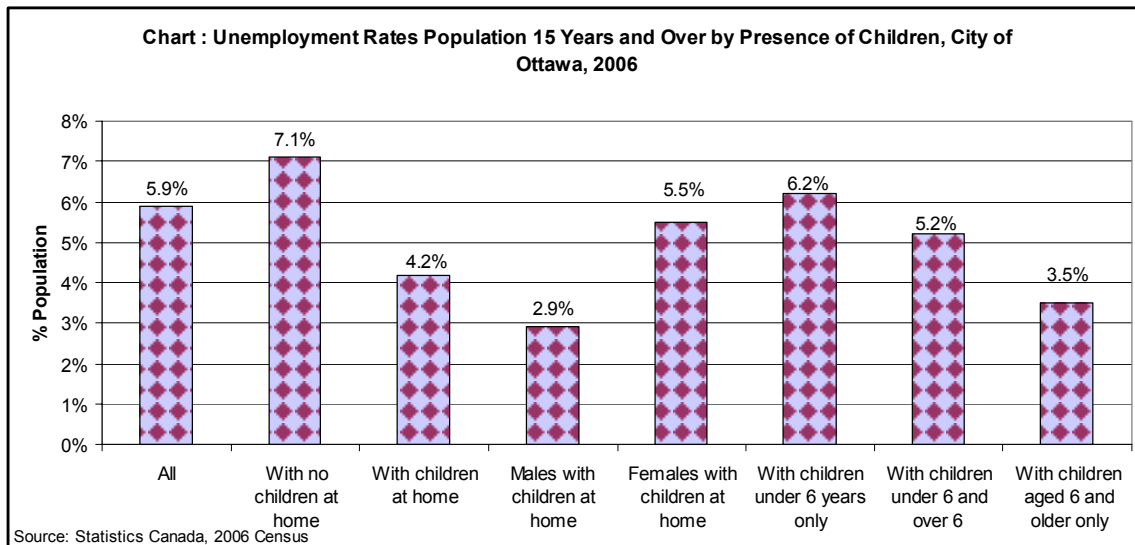

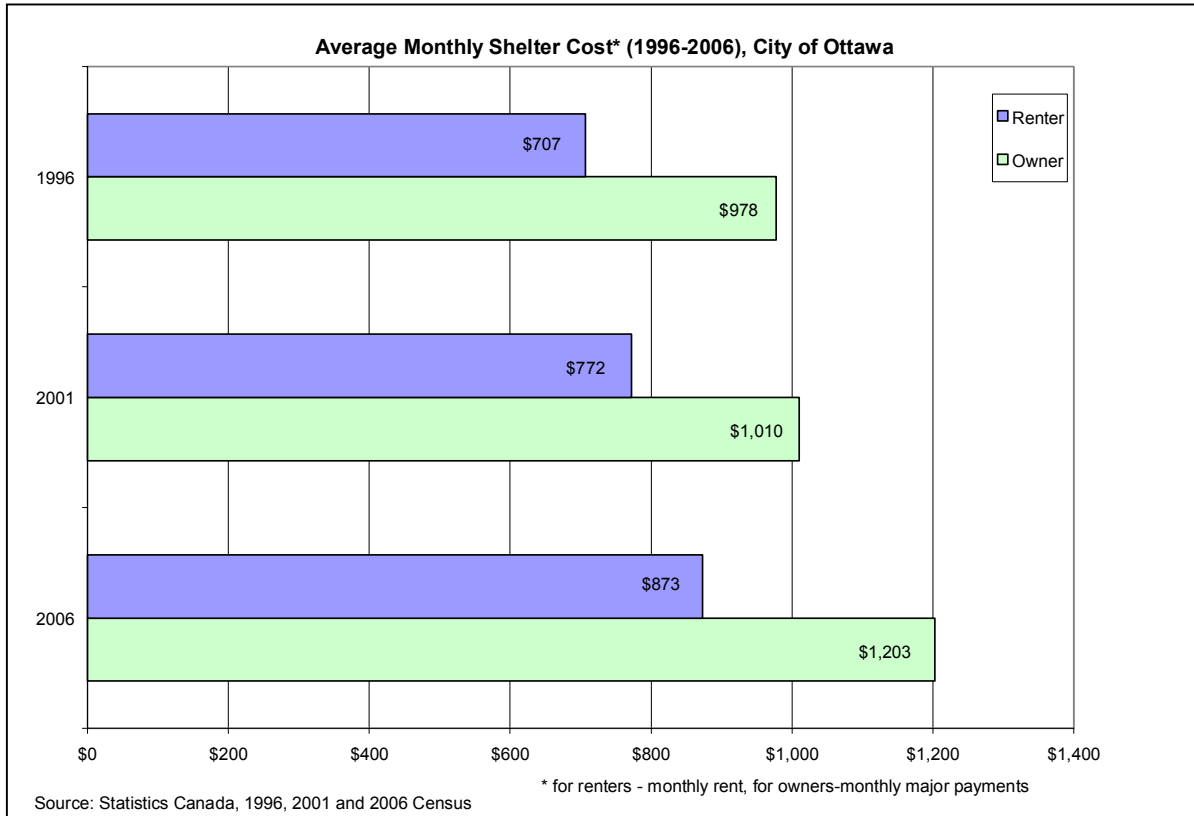

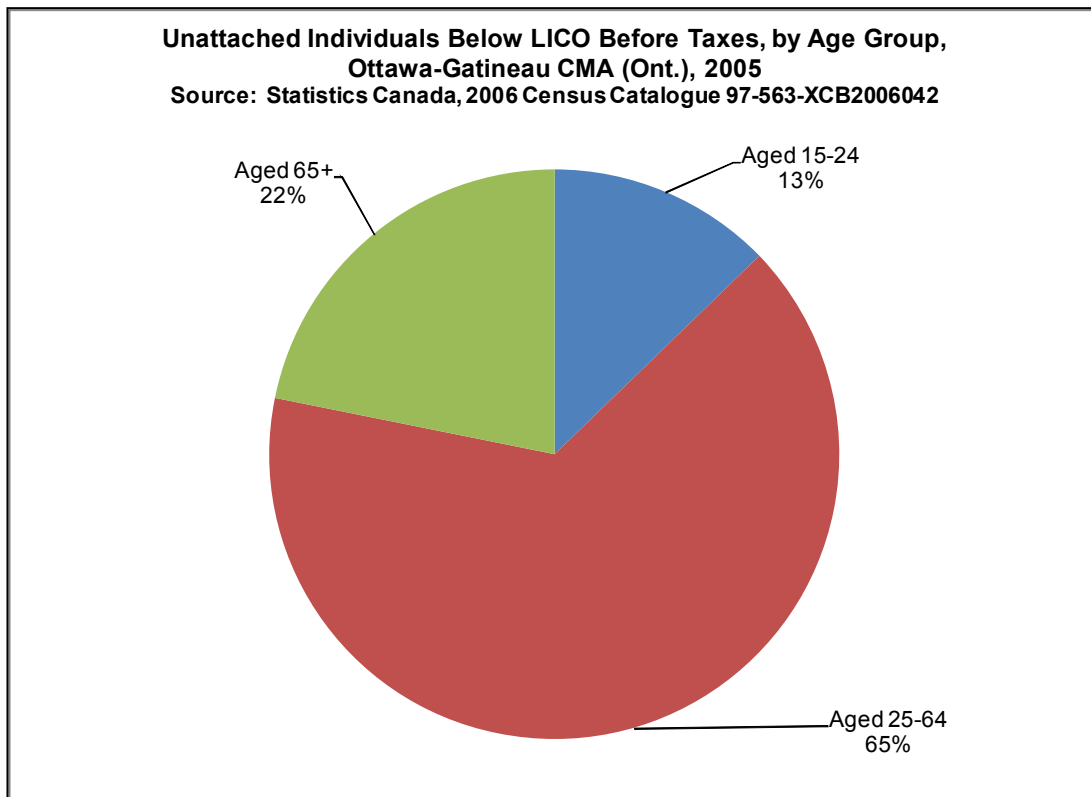

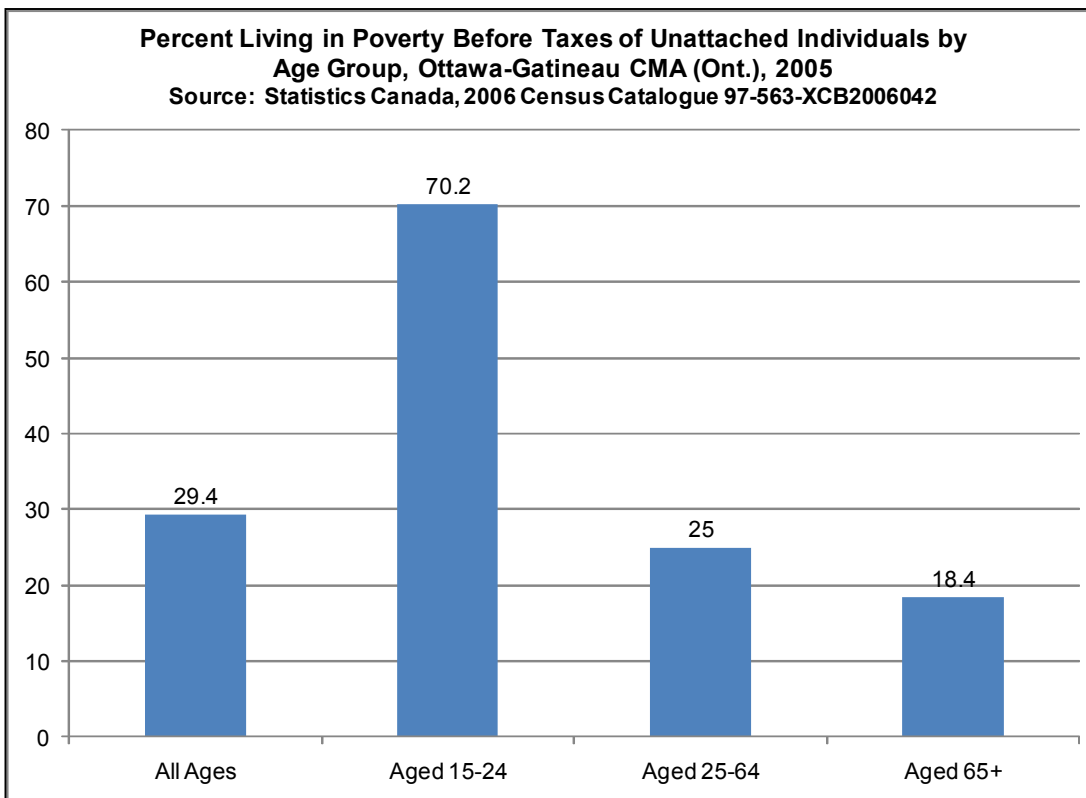

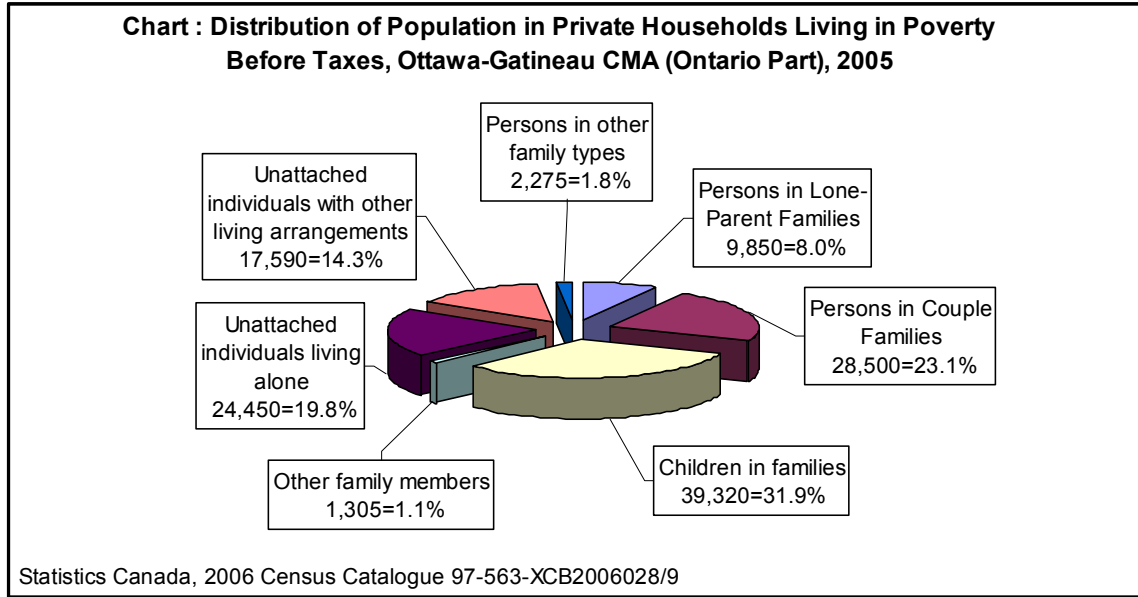

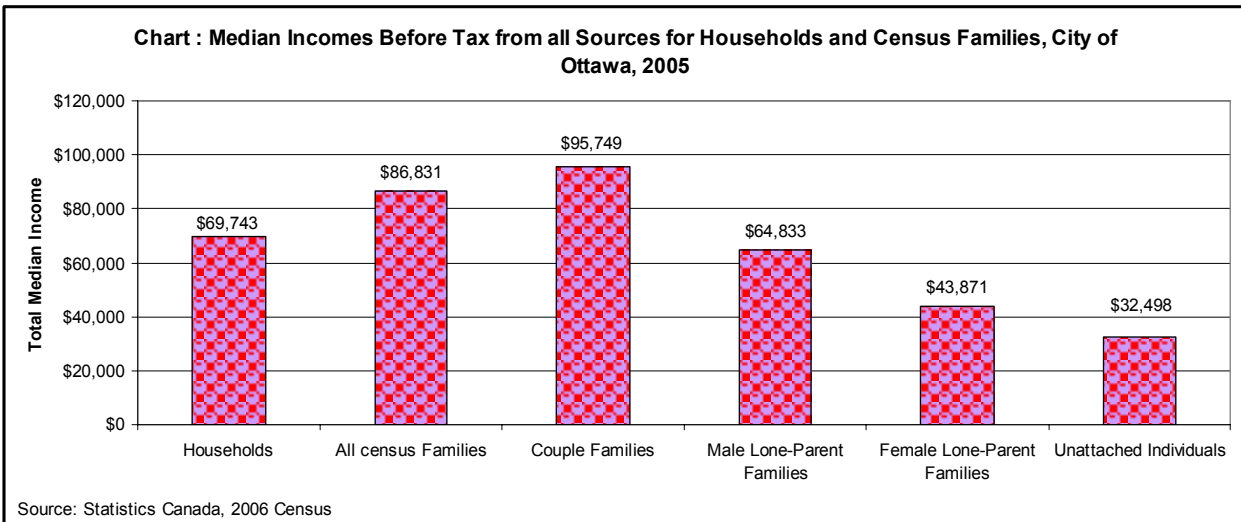

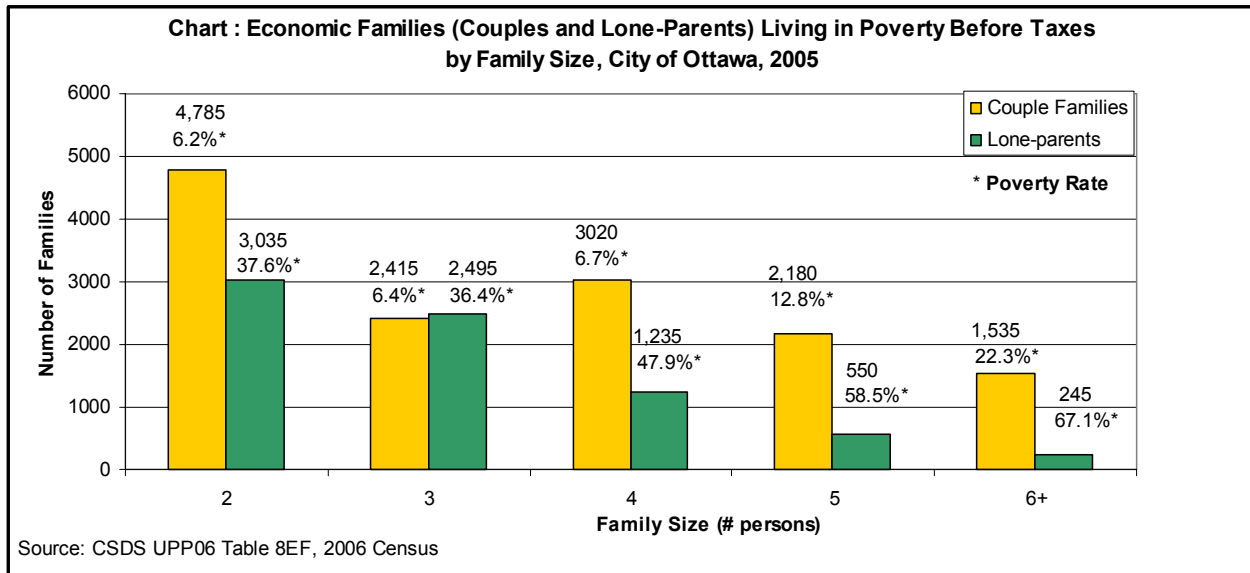

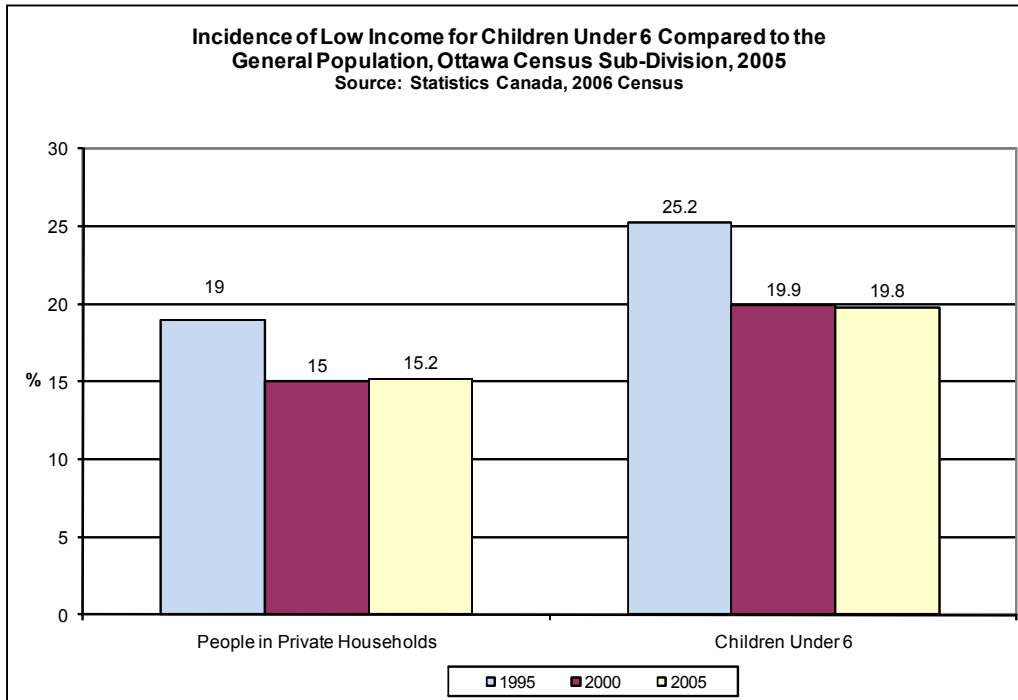

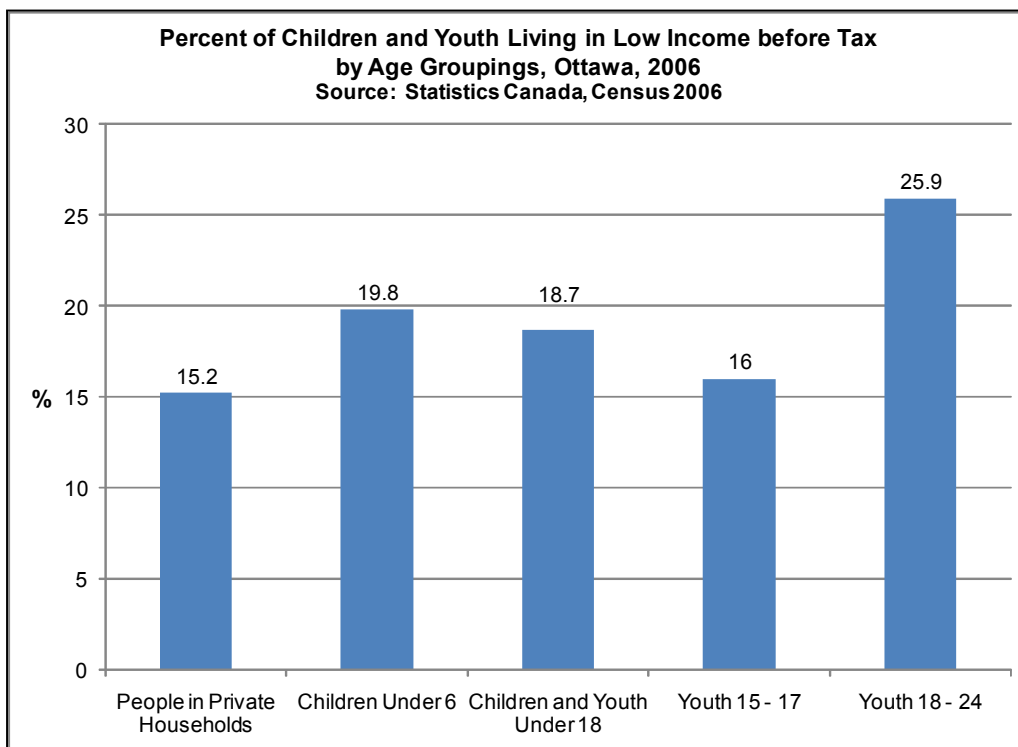

Percent of Children and Youth Living in Poverty by Age, 2006

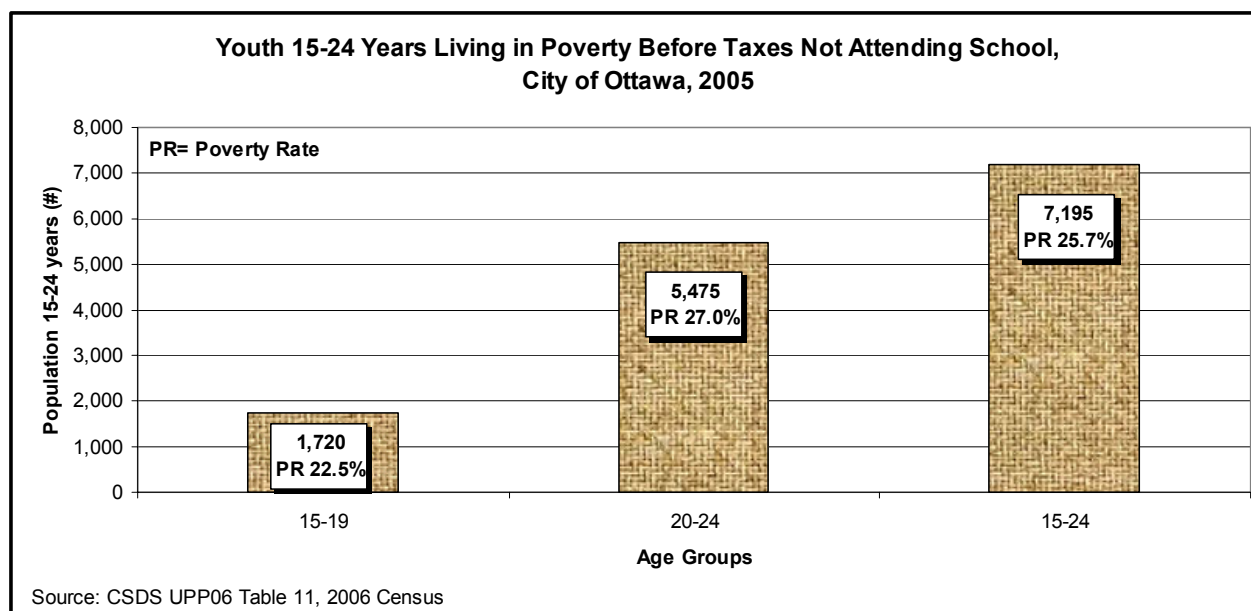

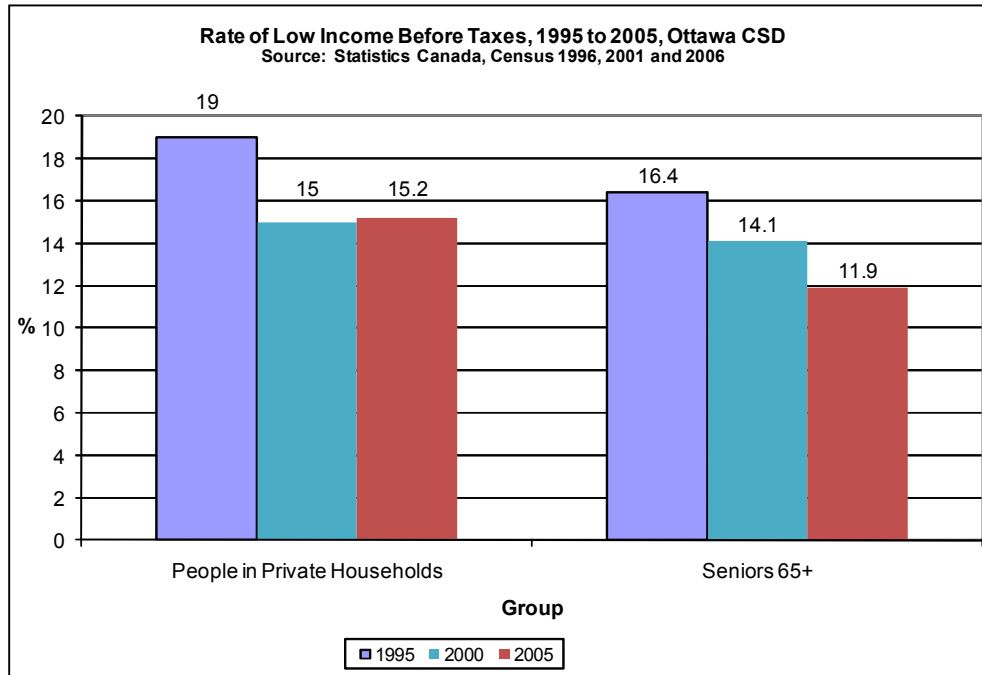

Rate of Low Income For Seniors, 1995 to 2005



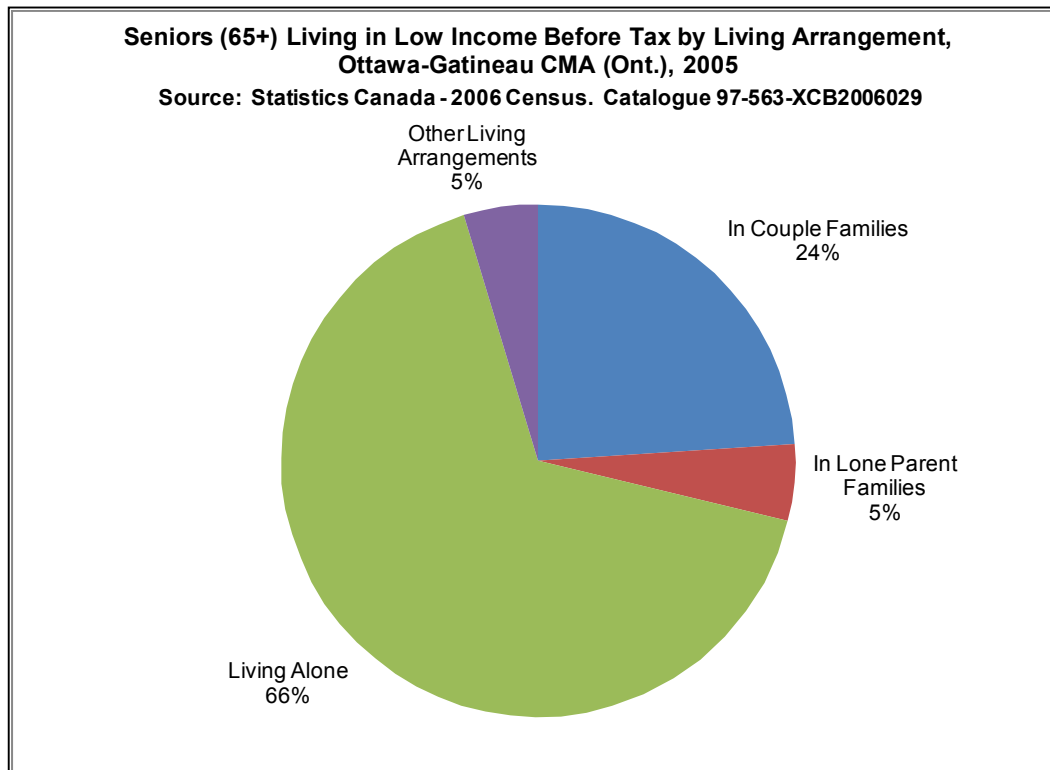

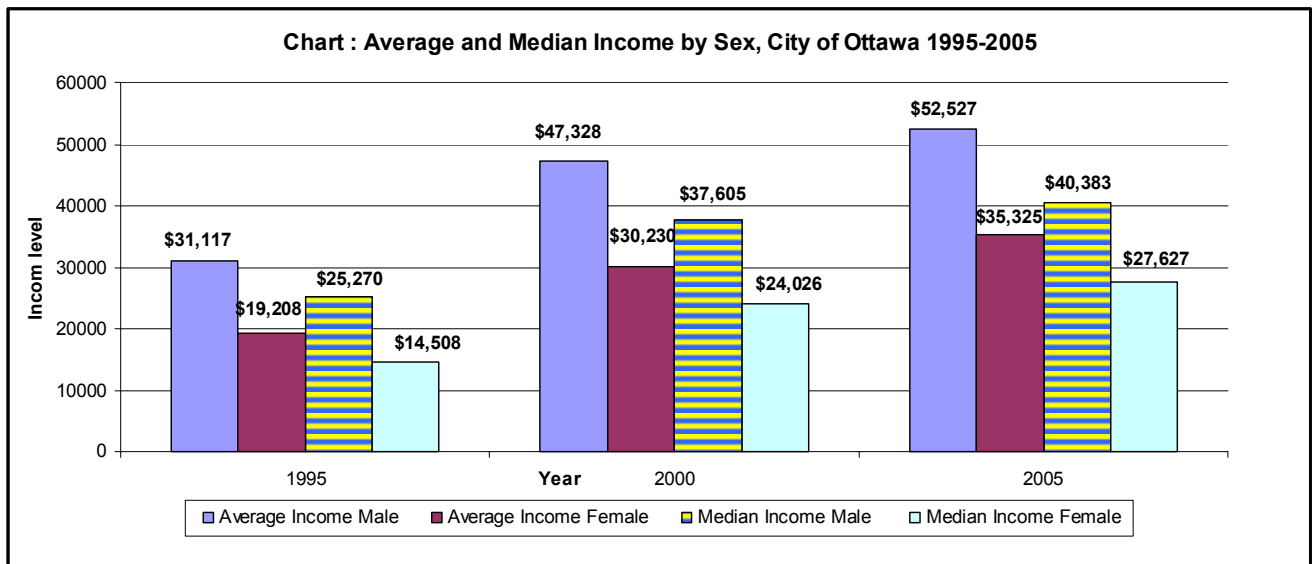

Average and Median Income by Sex, Ottawa, 2005

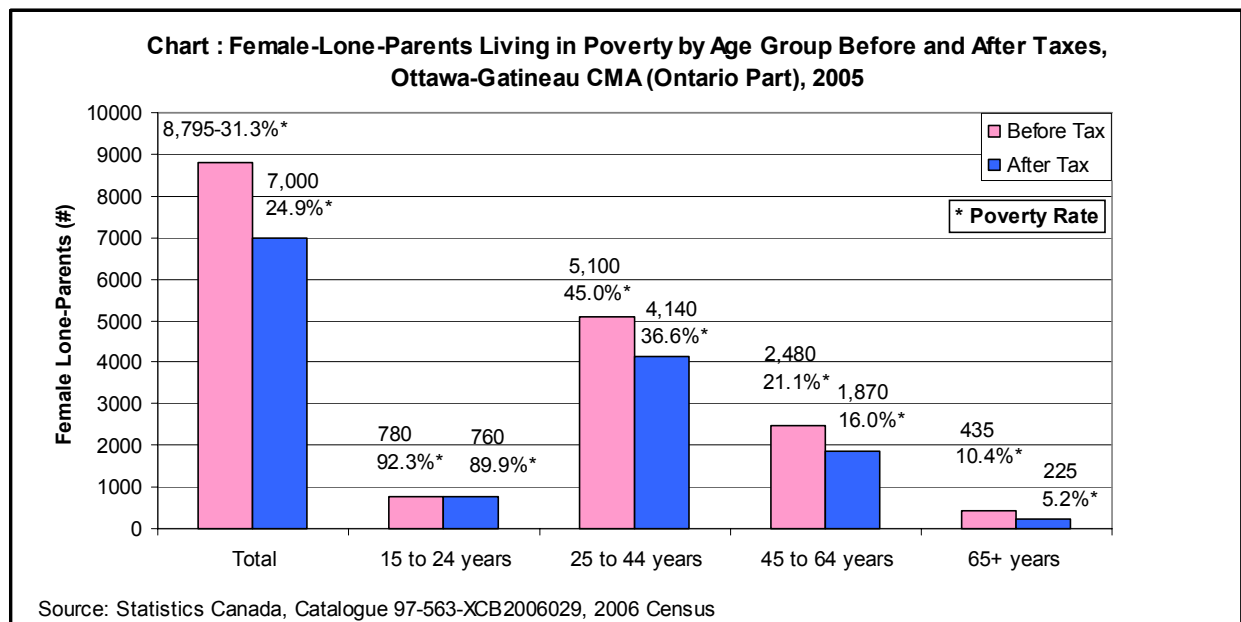

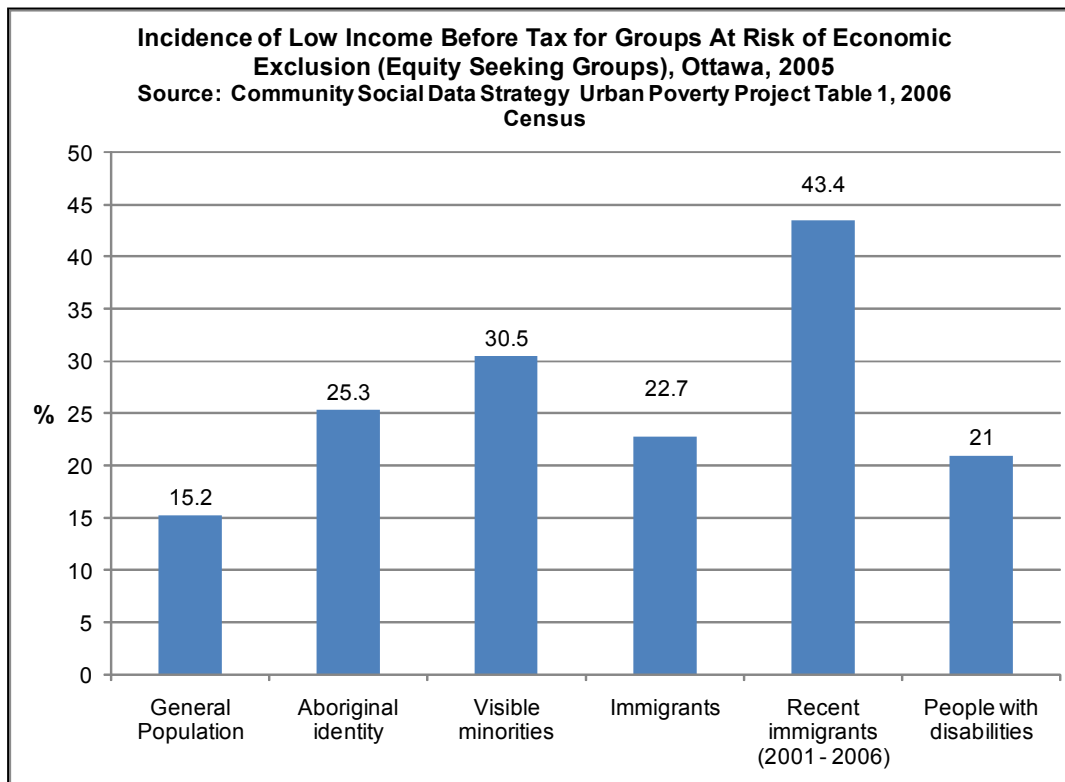

Incidence of Low Income Before Tax for equity Seeking Groups, 2005

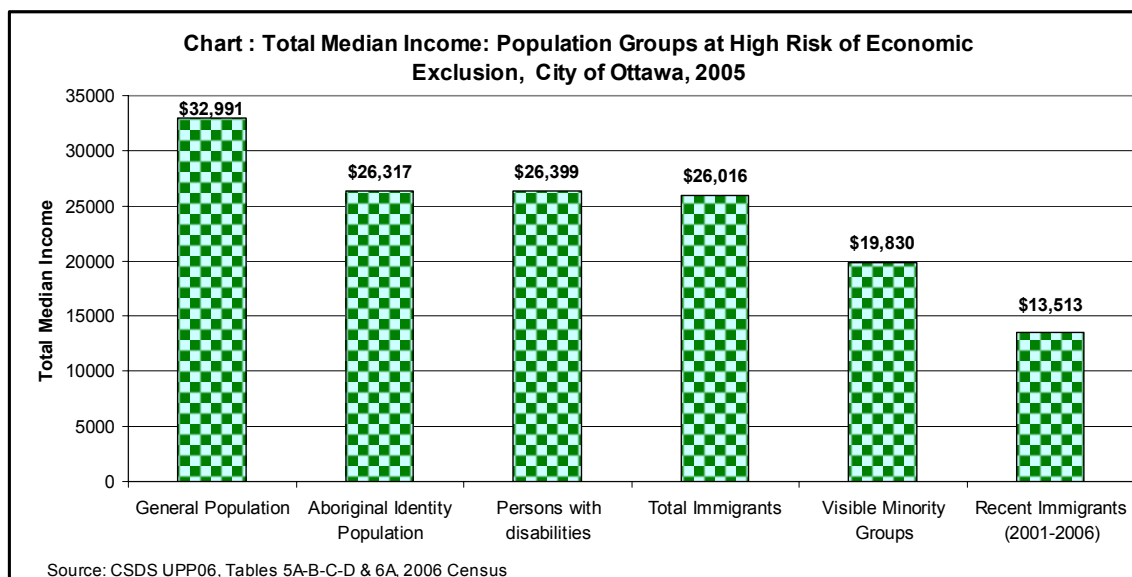

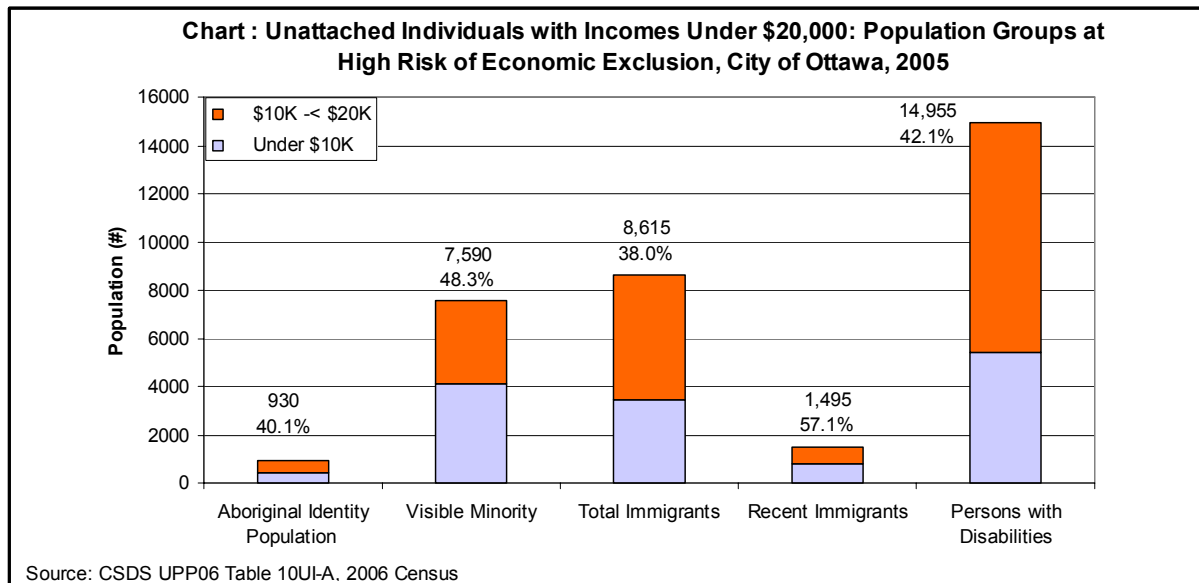

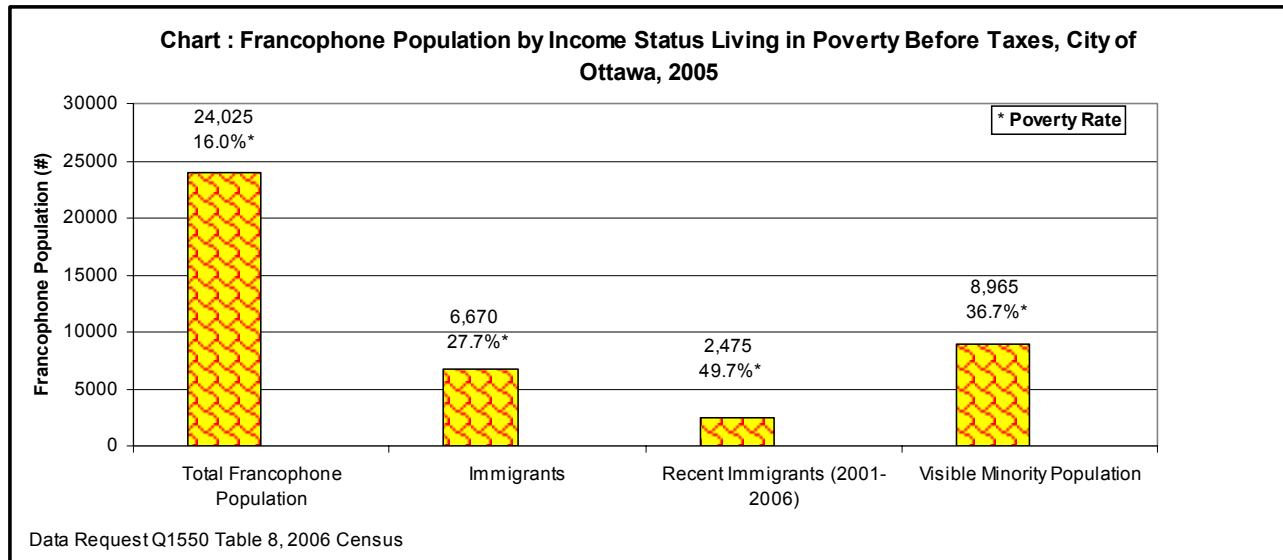

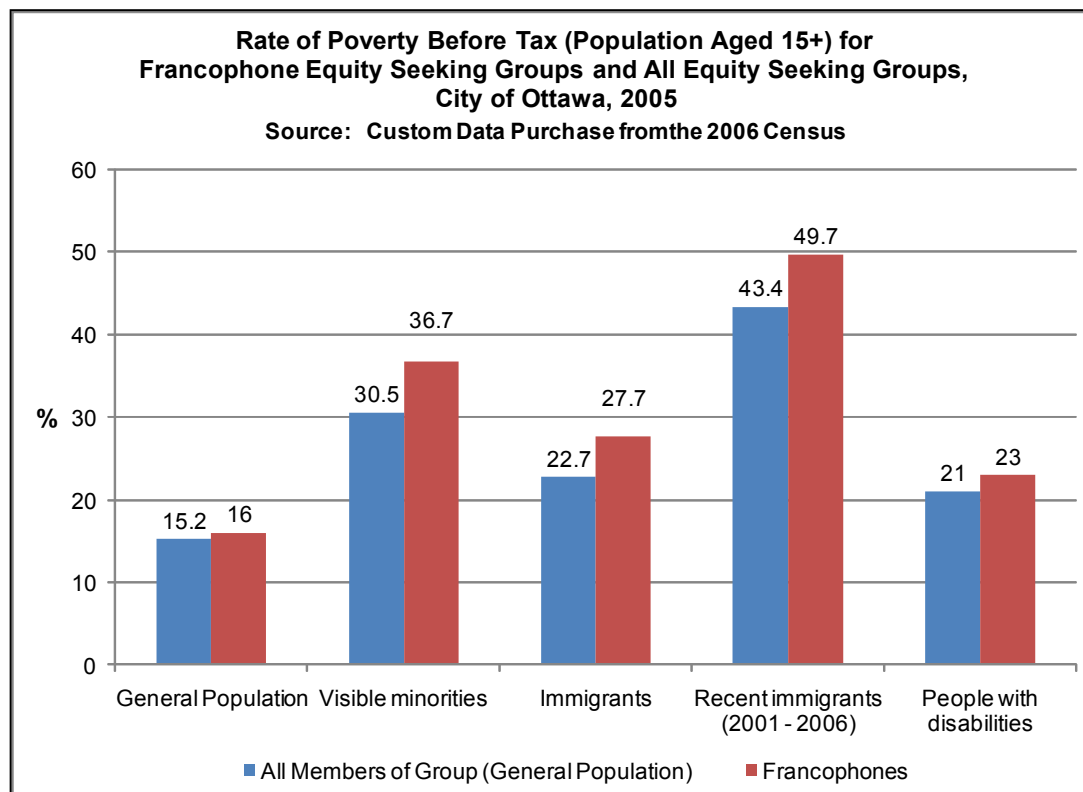
